



Hockey Girls




The girls hockey season was definitely one of note. It tested the girls' teamwork as well as their ability to communicate and listen.

By the end of camp the spirit of unity and family was definitely felt by all prefects and a sense of determination to face challenges ahead as the official Chilakudu team of 2020.


